Your little mare more closely resembles Lucitano /Quarter parents. Her fetlocks and pasterns are more delicate and her head isn't quite as convex as the Andalusian, She does have a sloping butt and a clean tail base, which in summer gives a smooth rear end profile.

I would guess she is a Lucitano / Quarter cross and will be stunning when she dries out. It takes at least 1 year for then to trust you and they are very stubborn. You need to be the boss but NOT MEAN. They get very 'chummy' and will treat you like another horse, which can be dangerous. They DO NOT respond to harsh punishment, they DO respond to routine and consistent training. They love a job because of their intelligence but will often decide when to quit so be consistent.

Distinguishing features:

- •The Lusitano often has a convex profile, Roman nose, powerful neck and hindquarters, high-stepping, or snapping out front of hooves at a trot.
- •Temperamentally, the Lusitano has a reputation for courage, with a <u>tendency to move</u> <u>forward toward that which threatens</u>, combining calmness with great fire while under saddle.
- •Lusitanos are reputed to be intelligent, to possess a sensible, levelheaded temperament and tendency to bond strongly with humans
