


The OEF is embarking on a new and exciting mandate in 2016 with a singular focus on enhancing the experience of its members and sharing our member's passion and love of the horse and sport.

Enhancing the member experience through...

Operational Excellence... member satisfaction, efficient operations, effective communication, engaged staff and strong governance.

Rider Development... developing the rider pathway from introduction to riding up to high performance to ensure all riders have access to a development pathway that matches their skill progression and desired participation.

Rider Programming... developing and delivering innovative rider programs for coaches and facilities for riders of all ages and stages of participation working with Equine Canada; developing rider and parent education materials to support making safe choices.

Coach Development... coach training and certification programs to ensure riders have access to qualified certified coaches at all levels of rider participation and development.

Facilities... facility governance practices and accreditation to ensure riders have access to safe and accredited riding facilities/stables that meet the level of participation and development.

Competition... training and certifying officials; and sanctioning competitions to ensure riders and coaches have access to stage appropriate, well governed events and qualified officiating.
